









NATIONAL SURVEY OF 3,219 CANADIANS

















METHODOLOGY

Online survey that interviewed 3,219 Canadian adults.

February 26th to March 7th, 2019.

The margin of error for a comparable probability-based random sample of the same size is +/- 1.73%, 19 times out of 20.

The data were weighted according to census data to ensure that the sample matched Canada's population according to age, gender, educational attainment, and region.

Totals may not add up to 100 due to rounding.










