Is Canada Ready? Flu Season & COVID-19




What Canadians are saying:

Canadians are more likely to get immunized against the flu this year because of COVID-19



57% of Canadians say they will definitely/probably get vaccinated this year, compared to 45% who claim they received the flu shot last year.


Plan on getting flu shot in upcoming season





1/3 of Canadians say they are more likely to get the flu shot because of COVID-19.

COVID-19 impact on flu shot





26% of those who were NOT vaccinated last season say they will definitely or probably get the flu shot this year, and that they are more likely to be vaccinated because of COVID-19.

Pharmacies continue to be the most likely place for vaccination this flu season

Likely source for flu shot





Older Canadians and those living in B.C, Alberta and Saskatchewan are most likely to get vaccinated at a pharmacy.

Top considerations for Canadians when deciding where to get a flu shot this year



Physical distancing and other infection control measures implemented on the premises 80% say important/ extremely important



Protective equipment (masks, gloves, etc.) worn by flu shot providers 80% say important/ extremely important



Limits on the number of people allowed on the premises at one time 76% say
important/
extremely important

What has pharmacists concerned?



Masks for patients

ensuring that a supply of disposable masks is available to patients if they don't have one



PPE

ensuring PPE is available for them and their staff



Costs

adequate remuneration to make this important public health measure viable because of the additional costs to do so safely
