



- 3. Reporting systems are robust




Patients and families can:

WHO estimates that medication errors cost US 42Billion annually


Challenge focus on:


- 1. High risk medication
- 2. Polypharmacy
- 3. Transitions of Care

Goal – to reduce medication harm by 50% within 5 years.

Global Launch: Political Core Messages to the Ministers



- 1. Medication-related harm is a global pandemic that has been documented for 60 years and continues to kill and cause illness amongst patients
- 2. Patients are harmed because:
 - Medicine naming, packaging and labelling causes confusion
 - Errors are made in prescribing and administering medicines
 - The patient is badly informed and disempowered
- 3. Today WHO has launched its third Global Patient Safety Challenge: Medication without Harm




Partnering with patients

Collaborative Process

- Completed environmental scan
- Working group consisted of patients, nurses, doctors and pharmacists developed a draft
- Feedback obtained from patients, clinicians, advisory panel and external stakeholder groups
- Checklist revised using the model for improvement and PDSA cycles and based on feedback received and tested

Co-Designed with Patients

1. CHANGES?

Have any medications been added, stopped or changed, and why?

2. CONTINUE?

What medications do I need to keep taking, and why?

3. PROPER USE?

How do I take my medications, and for how long?

4. MONITOR?

How will I know if my medication is working, and what side effects do I watch for?

5. FOLLOW-UP?

Do I need any tests and when do I book my next visit?



Keep your medication record up to date.

Remember to include:

- ✓ drug allergies
- vitamins and minerals
- √ herbal/natural products
- all medications including non-prescription products

Ask your doctor, nurse or pharmacist to review all your medications to see if any can be stopped or reduced.

Use TeachBack Method Confirm patient understanding

"Tell me what you've understood."

"I want to make sure I explained your medicine clearly. Can you tell me how you will take your medicine?"
